Essential English Update - Scott

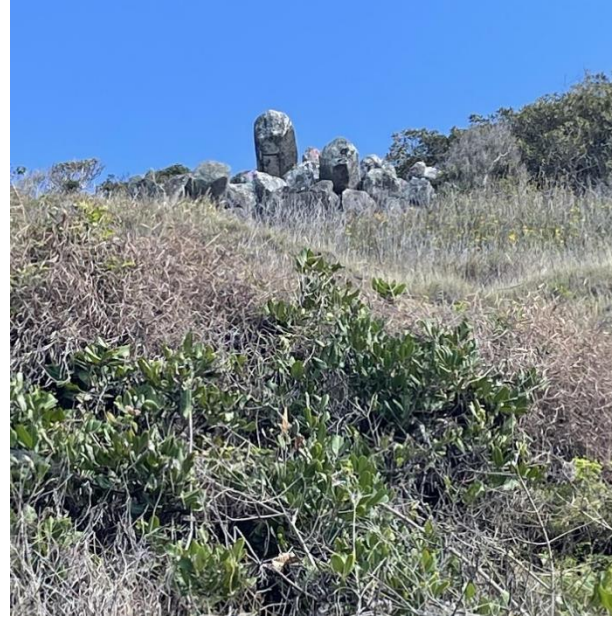
We made it! This term has been excellent, our new students have fit like a glove and our exciting students are consistently lovely and welcoming. The learning environment here is just amazing.

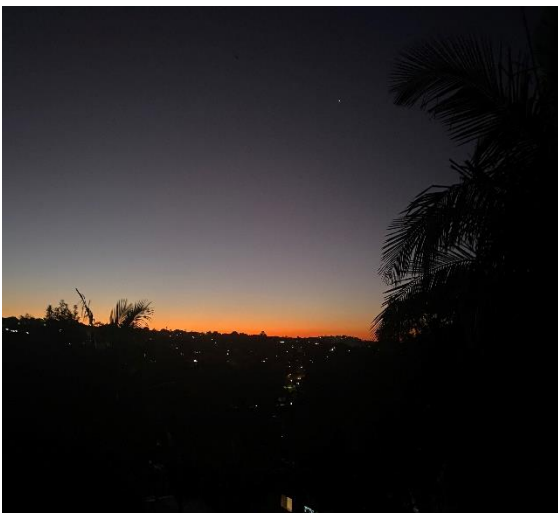

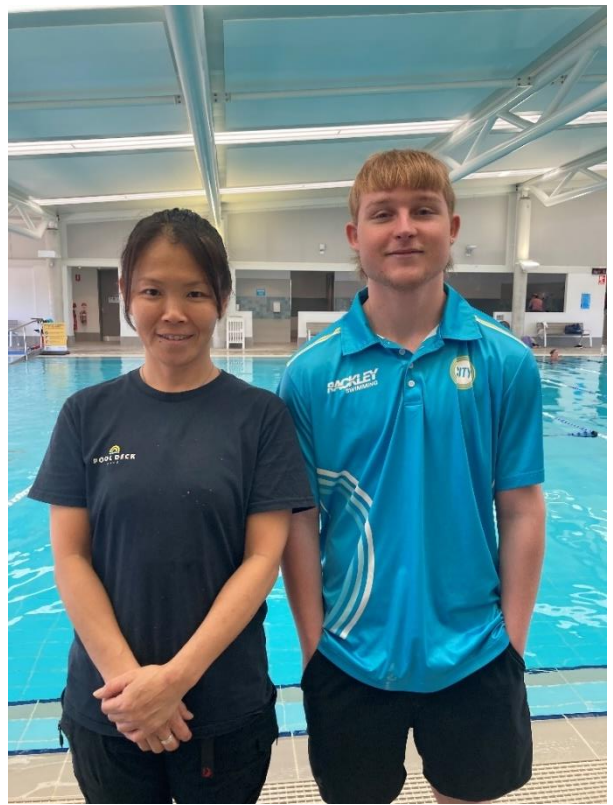

Key takeaways of Money Management Unit

- When you approach money management and financial planning in a smart and efficient way, it can help set you up for a bright and successful future.
- Money management is more than just budgeting.

What is money management?

Budgeting, investing, saving and even spending is all a part of money management. The students will learn how to build money confidence and set financial goals.

Year 11 Social and Community Studies

What is the relationship between art and community?

Culture generates social capital and strengthens a community's character. Art brings people together physically — at galleries, museums, performance spaces — and culturally, through its capacity to tell a community's shared story, to inspire reflection, and form connections that transcend differences.

Students will explore social connection between communities and the arts. Also, the nature of inclusion. Arts participants are more than twice as likely to volunteer in their communities, independent of education, age, gender, or ethnicity.

Year 12 Social and Community Studies

Year 12 will begin next term the Unit, ***Legally it could be You***. This begins by defining law. Following this student explore Australian and Queensland laws that they are aware of and ones they may not but will affect their daily life. This is followed by an explanation of the difference between customs, rules, and laws. The two main sources of law in Australia (case law and common law) are explained. There are lessons on the three levels of government and the laws they are responsible for. Next is information about who enforces the law, a definition for crime.
